The new commission structure, which goes into effect today, calculates commission based on the value of the cruise prior to the application of the Future Cruise Credit. Previously, the line calculated commission on these bookings after a Future Cruise Credit was applied. The new commission program adds incremental earning opportunities for the line's valued travel agent partners.
